If you measured out 1 cup of water in Step 1, then you would need 2 cups Plaster of Paris powder. Start adding the Plaster of Paris powder to the water in your mixing container by sprinkling or sifting the powder over the water. Generally, the proportion of Plaster of Paris to water is a ratio, with two parts Plaster of Paris to every one part water. Add the water to the container first, and then slowly add the Plaster of Paris, sprinkling it across the entire surface and allowing it to settle before adding more.
